

What's new in the East-West Connector study?

For the past several months, the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) has been listening to public input and studying the transportation needs and impacts of a new east-west roadway/transit corridor in northwestern Utah County between Redwood Road and I-15. UDOT has studied a number of alternative solutions.

On December 6, UDOT will hold an Alternatives Update Open House to present to the public each alternative, as well as UDOT's preferred alternative.

The most frequent comment from the public about the East-West Connector has been a request to provide an alternate route to Lehi Main Street as soon as possible. That's why UDOT will present alternatives in December rather than Spring 2008 as originally planned. The East-West Connector is a high priority project that will bring much needed relief from the current traffic congestion.

Public input will continue to be a critical element of the East-West Connector study process.

After the meeting, what's next?

Following the Alternatives Update Open House, UDOT will complete the environmental study process and hold a final public meeting (Summer 2008). Upon final approval, design and construction can begin. Construction is expected to last from Spring 2009 – Fall 2010. The project is fully funded.
